

## Profile

Keihin Electric Express Railway Co., Ltd. (commonly known as Keikyu), is one of the 15 major private railways in Japan. Serving as a link between central Tokyo and the southern metropolitan area, the Company plays an important role in Tokyo's public transportation system. Since its founding in 1898, Keikyu and its Group companies have worked to develop the Group's core rail and road transportation businesses and established operations in real estate, tourism and leisure, distribution, and other sectors. And, the Keikyu Group intends to expand its businesses further still.

In its railway operations, Keikyu carries approximately 1.14 million passengers daily on its 87.0-kilometer railway network linking Shinagawa, which is expected to see even further development in the near future as one of Tokyo's sub-central towns, with Kawasaki, Yokohama, Yokosuka, Zushi, and Miura in Kanagawa Prefecture. In November 1998, the Company achieved its long-standing goal of providing railway services to Tokyo International Airport (Haneda Airport). With the opening of Haneda Airport Station, Keikyu has been instrumental in greatly improving access to the airport. Number of passengers has continued to rise, and on the third anniversary of its opening, in November 2001, the total number of passengers had exceeded 50 million. Following the planned opening of a new terminal at Haneda Airport in 2003, passenger demand for travel to and from Haneda Airport is expected to rise even further and to make a larger contribution to the Company's future revenue.
